CT ABDOMEN AND PELVIS

65 year old man with history of carcinoma of the prostate and known right adrenal lesion - progress.

Comparison scan: 31/10/2016.

Primary Tumour:

No local recurrence is seen at the prostate.

Loco-Regional Lymph Nodes:

None detected.

Metastases:

No metastases are seen in the liver, lung bases, bones, adrenal glands or peritoneum.

Other Findings:

As previously there is a 30mm ovoid right adrenal mass. This has a pre-contrast density of 3HU. This density and lack of growth in the last 2 years confirms benign pathology. This almost certainly represents an incidental non-functioning adrenal adenoma.

The right kidney measures 11cm in length and the left 8.5cm in length. No hydronephrosis, calculus or mass is seen.

No bladder abnormality is detected.

No other abnormality is seen in the abdomen or pelvis.

SUMMARY:

No local recurrence or metastatic disease detected.

Stable 30mm low density mass on the right adrenal gland with density and biologic behaviour consistent with incidental adrenal adenoma.
